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## Hubbard Street Dance Chicago Announces 2018-19 Season Programming

Collaborations with Third Coast Percussion, Emma Portner, Lil Buck, Jon Boogz, and Malpaso Dance Company to fill Season 41

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CHICAGO – Launching its fifth decade as one of the country's leading contemporary dance companies, <u>Hubbard Street Dance Chicago</u> and Artistic Director **Glenn Edgerton** are excited to announce a season replete with world premieres, choreographic innovation, and international collaborations for 2018-19.

The Season 41 Fall Series, September 27, 29 & 30, 2018 at the Harris Theater, brings together Grammy award-winning Chicago music sensation Third Coast Percussion with three exceptional choreographers who are redefining what it means to make dance today – Emma Portner, famous for her imaginative viral dance videos, and co-founders of Movement Art Is: Lil Buck, an ambassador of jookin, an urban dance style originated in Memphis, and Jon Boogz, a director/choreographer known for his blend of popping dance style and conceptual art films. The new music is by producer Devonté Hynes (aka Blood Orange) and features Third Coast Percussion performing live. The new eveninglength work focuses on sustainability, the principles of Paul Stamets' book "Mycelium Running," and how the environment is affected by the social issues facing our world today. The engagement features lighting by Jim French and costumes by Hogan McLaughlin.

danc(e)volve: New Works Festival returns for Season 41, December 6, 8 & 9, 2018 at the Harris Theater, highlighting the inventive choreography of Hubbard Street's own artists. Creating all new works are Hubbard Street Choreographic Fellows Alice Klock, named one of Dance Magazine's 25 to watch for 2018, Florian Lochner, and Rena Butler.

Malpaso Dance Company, one of the most sought-after Cuban dance companies in the world, and Hubbard Street team up for a unique collaboration during the Spring Series, March 2 & 3, 2019 at the Auditorium Theatre. The two-night engagement features a collaborative work danced together by both companies, along with two world premieres; a piece for Hubbard Street choreographed by Malpaso Artistic Director Osnel Delgado, and a piece for Malpaso Dance Company, commissioned by the Auditorium Theatre, choreographed by Hubbard Street's former dancer turned choreographer and three-time Princess Grace award-winner Robyn Mineko Williams.

"Collaborating with Third Coast Percussion has been a goal of mine for many years. Bringing Malpaso Dance Company and its culture together with Hubbard Street will also be an inspiring and exciting endeavor," said Edgerton. "These two major collaborations within one season, not to mention all the great choreographic artists and designers, will bring Hubbard Street to new heights not yet seen before in our 40 year history." Hubbard Street concludes Season 41 June 6, 8 & 9, 2019 at the Harris Theater, with the Summer Series featuring works by Crystal Pite, one of the foremost contemporary choreographers today; Resident Choreographer Alejandro Cerrudo; and the return of Brian Brooks' *Terrain*, called "a lush movement exchange" by See Chicago Dance, first premiered by Hubbard Street in 2016.

Tickets to the three engagements at the <u>Harris Theater for Music and Dance in Millennium Park</u> located at 205 East Randolph Street, and a fourth performance at the <u>Auditorium Theatre</u>, are now on sale as a Season 41 subscription; single tickets will go on sale following the Season 40 Summer Series, June 7–10, 2018.
